2 Corinthians 5:7 (New King James Version)

7 For we walk by faith, not by sight.

Habakkuk 2:2-4 (Amplified Bible)

2And the Lord answered me and said, Write the vision and engrave it so plainly upon tablets that everyone who passes may [be able to] read [it easily and quickly] as he hastens by. 3For the vision is yet for an appointed time and it hastens to the end [fulfillment]; it will not deceive or disappoint. Though it tarry, wait [earnestly] for it, because it will surely come; it will not be behindhand on its appointed day. 4Look at the proud; his soul is not straight or right within him, but the [rigidly] just and the [uncompromisingly] righteous man shall live by his faith and in his faithfulness.

Foundational Scripture

Proverbs 29:18 (Amplified Bible)

18Where there is no vision [no redemptive revelation of God], the people perish; but he who keeps the law [of God, which includes that of man]--blessed (happy, fortunate, and enviable) is he.

Proverbs 29:18 (New International Version)

18 Where there is no revelation, the people cast off restraint; but blessed is he who keeps the law.

Proverbs 29:18 (Contemporary English Version)

18 Without guidance from God, law and order disappear, but God blesses everyone who obeys his Law.

Vision Definition

- 1 a: something seen in a dream, trance, or ecstasy esp : a supernatural appearance that conveys a revelation
b: a thought, concept, or object formed by the imagination
c: a manifestation to the senses of something immaterial
- 2 a: the act or power of imagination
B (1) : mode of seeing or conceiving
(2) : unusual discernment or foresight "a person of vision"
c: direct mystical awareness of the supernatural usu. in visible form
