Trust HIM with Everything

- **The idea of giving up everything will never be an option for the person that is satisfied, comfortable, or unaware.**
- **The idea of giving up everything comes from the understanding that everything is the Lord's (Psalm 24:1, 1 Corinthians 10:26) and we are stewards of what has been given to us. It means that the Body of Christ has access to whatever has been given to us on loan.**
- **God only hung out with two kinds of people...Those who had a lot and was willing to give up everything; or those who had nothing at all and saw Him as everything.**

Luke 8:1-3 (New Living Translation, NLT)

1 Soon afterward Jesus began a tour of the nearby towns and villages, preaching and announcing the Good News about the Kingdom of God. He took his twelve disciples with him, 2 along with some women who had been cured of evil spirits and diseases. Among them were Mary Magdalene, from whom he had cast out seven demons; 3 Joanna, the wife of Chuza, Herod's business manager; Susanna; and many others who were contributing from their own resources to support Jesus and his disciples.

I trust HIM with my life!

Matthew 4:18-22 (Amplified Bible, AMP)

18 As Jesus was walking by the Sea of Galilee, He noticed two brothers, Simon who was called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen. 19 And He said to them, "Follow Me [as My disciples, accepting Me as your Master and Teacher and walking the same path of life that I walk], and I will make you fishers of men." 20 **Immediately they left their nets and followed Him [becoming His disciples, believing and trusting in Him and following**

His example]. 21 And going on [further] from there He noticed two other brothers, James the son of Zebedee, and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets; and He called them [to follow Him as His disciples]. 22 **Immediately they left the boat and their father, and followed Him [becoming His disciples, believing and trusting in Him and following His example].**

Luke 5:27-32 (AMP)

27 After this Jesus went out and noticed a tax collector named Levi (Matthew) sitting at the tax booth; and He said to him, **“Follow Me [as My disciple, accepting Me as your Master and Teacher and walking the same path of life that I walk].”** 28 **And he left everything behind and got up and *began* to follow Jesus [as His disciple].** 29 Levi (Matthew) gave a great banquet for Him at his house; and there was a large crowd of tax collectors and others who were reclining *at the table* with them. 30 The Pharisees and their scribes [seeing those with whom He was associating] *began* murmuring in discontent to His disciples, asking, “Why are you eating and drinking with the tax collectors and sinners [including non-observant Jews]?” 31 And Jesus replied to them, “It is not those who are healthy who need a physician, but [only] those who are sick. 32 I did not come to call the [self-proclaimed] righteous [who see no need to repent], but sinners to repentance [to change their old way of thinking, to turn from sin and to seek God and His righteousness].”

What is in your life that you treasure more than God?

Mark 10:17-22 (AMP)

17 As He was leaving on His journey, a man ran up and knelt before Him and asked Him, “Good Teacher [You who are essentially good and morally perfect], what shall I do to inherit eternal life [that is, eternal salvation in the Messiah’s kingdom]?” 18 Jesus said to him, “Why do you call Me good? No one is [essentially] good [by nature] except God alone. 19 You know the commandments: ‘Do not murder, Do not commit adultery, Do not steal, Do not testify falsely, Do not defraud, Honor your father and mother.’” 20 And he replied to Him, “Teacher, I have [carefully] kept all these [commandments] since my youth.” 21 **Looking at him, Jesus felt a love (high regard, compassion) for him, and He said to him, “You lack one thing: go and sell all your property and give [the money] to the poor, and you will have [abundant] treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me [becoming My disciple, believing and trusting in Me and walking the same path of life that I walk].”** 22 But the man was saddened at Jesus’ words, and he left grieving, because he owned much property *and* had many possessions [which he treasured more than his relationship with God].

Trust HIM with Everything

Matthew 6:33 (AMP)

33 But first *and* most importantly seek (aim at, strive after) His kingdom and His righteousness [His way of doing and being right—the attitude and character of God], and all these things will be given to you also.

Matthew 6:32-33 (NLT)

32 These things dominate the thoughts of unbelievers, but your heavenly Father already knows all your needs. 33 Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need.

What happens when I give up EVERYTHING?

Mark 10:23-30 (AMP)

23 Jesus looked around and said to His disciples, “How difficult it will be for those who are wealthy [and cling to possessions and status as security] to enter the kingdom of God!” 24 The disciples were amazed *and* bewildered by His words. But Jesus said to them again, “Children, how difficult it is [for those who place their hope and confidence in riches] to enter the kingdom of God! 25 It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man [who places his faith in wealth or status] to enter the kingdom of God.” 26 They were completely *and* utterly astonished, and said to Him, “Then who can be saved [from the wrath of God]?” 27 Looking at them, Jesus said, “With people [as far as it depends on them] it is impossible, but not with God; for all things are possible with God.” 28 **Peter started saying to Him, “Look, we have given up everything and followed You [becoming Your disciples and accepting You as Teacher and Lord].”** 29 Jesus said, “I assure you *and* most solemnly say to you, there is no one who has given up a house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or farms, for My sake and for the gospel’s sake, 30 who will not receive a **hundred times as much now in the present age—houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and farms—along with persecutions;** and in the age to come, eternal life.

Who do you think God is?

➤ **The answer to this will determine your next faith reaction**

Matthew 16:13-20 (Living Bible, TLB)

13 When Jesus came to Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, “**Who are the people saying I am?**” 14 “Well,” they replied, “some say John the Baptist; some, Elijah; some, Jeremiah or one of the other prophets.” 15 Then he asked them, “**Who do you think I am?**” 16 Simon Peter answered, “The Christ, the Messiah, the Son of the living God.” 17 “God has blessed you, Simon, son of Jonah,” Jesus said, “for my Father in heaven has personally revealed this to you—this is not from any human source.

God says who He is!

John 11:17-29 (AMP)

17 So when Jesus arrived, He found that Lazarus had already been in the tomb four days.

18 Bethany was near Jerusalem, about two miles away; 19 and many of the Jews had come to see Martha and Mary, to comfort them concerning [the loss of] their brother. 20 So when Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went to meet Him, while Mary remained sitting in the house. 21 Then Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died. 22 Even now I know that whatever You ask of God, God will give to You." 23 Jesus told her, "Your brother will rise [from the dead]." 24 Martha replied, "I know that he will rise [from the dead] in the resurrection on the last day." 25 Jesus said to her, "**I am the Resurrection and the Life. Whoever believes in (adheres to, trusts in, relies on) Me [as Savior] will live even if he dies; 26 and everyone who lives and believes in Me [as Savior] will never die. Do you believe this?**" 27 She said to Him, "Yes, Lord; I have believed and continue to believe that You are the Christ (the Messiah, the Anointed), the Son of God, He who was [destined and promised] to come into the world [and it is for You that the world has waited]." 28 After she had said this, she left and called her sister Mary, privately whispering [to her], "The Teacher is here and is asking for you." 29 And when she heard this, she got up quickly and went to Him.
